Reunion Planning Progresses! The dates and events are set!

On November 30th the reunion planning committee (Lt. Tom Musson DMCCC at Forbes/Colonel USAF retired and Don Peoples A1c MMT Operations training at Forbes) met for their first in person reunion planning meeting. The meeting was held at the Angler's restaurant and marina in Kent Narrows, MD.

The Angler's was selected mainly due to the fact that it was at the midway point between our locations and their web page made a good impression. Were we surprised! For those wondering, no the association did not pick up the tab. We shared views on which date would be best for a start date and the number of days that we would need for activities. Tom shared his plans for the History/Biography booklet. We compared notes on our methods of contacting members and highlights of some of those phone conversations. One very important topic discussed was the number of vacant seats on the reunion committee. This is your reunion and everyone is welcome to step up and handle a small portion of the work to make this a fun and memorable event. Here is a schedule of our reunion activities; the times are susceptible to change.

Members Contacted:

We have made great progress on locating members in the past year. Up to this point in time we have made contact with 361 members or members of their family. On a more somber note, as we all know, time marches on and with the passage of time people pass on, unfortunately we have found 53 of our group who are no longer with us. Perhaps they'll be watching the reunion activities from above. Last spring while phoning members, I was told that several years ago someone in California was trying to gather information on the 548th. A few months later I was forwarded a copy of the following letter penned by one of our departed brothers.

Dear Sir;

As a former member of the 548th SMS, it was my pleasure to take part in the recent launch of the last Atlas "E" in the inventory. I was surprised to learn that this particular Atlas was also a former member of the 548th, having been delivered new in 1961 to Forbes AFB. Missile history has become a subject of great interest here in the Vandenberg area and with the demise of the Strategic Air Command, much of this history may have been lost. My donation to this effort is to compile as much information on the 548th as possible, after all these years.

I have started a list of personnel from memory and a few sets of old orders. Please add any information that you recall from the 548th. Any copies of orders, pictures, maps etc. will be of great value. The individual ranks I have listed are circa 1961. Where first names and middle initials are missing it is because I do not have them. Please feel free to make your own copies of this list, then use my list to annotate additions and additional info and return it in this postage paid envelope.

Because I was in maintenance, I will need all the help I can get in sorting out the operations side of the house. If anyone can help me get in touch with someone who was in operations, please send addresses.

Ed Note: As a result of Ken's letter we have been made aware that 45-E was involved in 2 historical events 3 decades apart. Rather than scraping the surplus Atlas ICBM's the Air Force put 141 of them in storage at Norton AFB. They were later refurbished for use in the space program. The last Atlas "45-E" was launched March 24, 1995 to place a Defense Meteorological Satellite Program space vehicle into a 458-nautical-mile polar orbit. Ken's list added about 70 more names to those that I had already gathered, bringing it to a total of 811 names.

Complex Facts:

Even though most of our missile sites have been dormant for almost 40 years some are still receiving media attention. The Peden's home site #6 by Dover is routinely featured in the press and on film. In January it was one of the featured homes on HGTV's Subterranean Homes.

of (TCE) Trichlorethylene contamination in several Wamego area wells. If you remember the engines were flushed with TCE after a propellant loading exercise. During the month of February there has been an ongoing trial in Federal court in Topeka. Two men have been accused of manufacturing LSD in site 7 at Wamego.
