



# COMMANDER'S BRIEFING

Being retired we take full advantage of our ability to travel to warmer climates during the colder weather. This year we have become "Snowbirds" so we will be spending 3 or 4 months in the Orlando and Homestead areas of Florida. While in Orlando with plenty of time to sightsee, we decided to pay a visit to the Kennedy Space Center, we haven't been there since about 1983. Things have really changed in those 22 years; one notable difference is the new Apollo/Saturn V museum building that houses the Saturn V moon rocket. While taking photos of the Saturn V booster engines I noticed a baffle (concentric rings & blades) adjacent to the injector

Plate inside of one of the booster engines. As soon as I saw that booster I had an immediate flashback to the 548<sup>th</sup> SMS MAB. While I was working as an MMT in Maintenance during the Atlas update program, I was working with the engine shop replacing engines on one of the "Birds" with the new updated engines. When I saw that the new engines incorporated a baffle adjacent to the injector plate, I recall the thrill that I experienced, for the following reason.



Prior to entering the Air Force and for about 10 years after leaving the service, I was employed at Princeton University in

Mechanical & Aerospace Engineering Department. Our research project at the university was experimental research of Instability in Liquid Rocket Engines. The instability phenomenon was a major factor in failures during launch in the early days of rocketry. A large part of our work was designing and installing various configurations of baffles in the experimental rocket engines. We would test fire the engine then break it down and re-install another baffle in another configuration then fire again. This research, along with the resulting baffles, that helped stabilize the initial start of a rocket engine were a huge factor in the increased reliability of liquid rocket launches in the early days and one of the reasons for the new engines on the Atlas. I never did know if any other maintenance people knew of the reason for the peculiar rings inside the engines. It was such a good feeling, knowing that the work that we did applied directly to the Atlas and Saturn V/Apollo projects.
